COVETING "THE PRECIOUS" Wizards Conjure Coins and Other "Precious Metals" at April Meeting

Why devote a monthly meeting to coin magic alone, when you can expand the possibilities by performing "Magic with Precious Metals" instead? That's how the Westside Wizards approached their April meeting, performing a broad range of metal-themed effects.

Phil Goodman kicked off the "metal magic" with some gold-standard coin work: one became two, then three; two in each hand become a single coin in one hand; soon all four coins reappeared before transforming into Chinese coins.

Bruce Schroffel, who claimed he's "just a hobbyist with a dented zombie ball," actually researched precious metals instead of performing... a project which entailed creating a circular chart that listed several of them metals. One randomly chosen number later, Bruce arrived at the listing for gold. Lo and behold: the back of his chart had a gold-colored French fry container!

Studying quantum flux doesn't intimidate **Alexander Scianna**, who explained it's where "the possibilities of matter reside." His proof? If he "observes the flux," he can create matter—such as a coin that appears from thin air. Toss it back to the flux, it disappears... only to reappear whenever he grabs for it. As Alexander said, "it's the flux of all possibility!"

Coins aside, **Brian Schwartz** noted there are precious metals in our hands every day: our phones. With **Jim Witoszynski** and Phil as volunteers—one to use their web browser to find the most-searched songs, the other to offer a random number—Brian showed that "technology knows what other technology is doing" by asking "Siri" to identify the song that the nearby phone had found at the chosen number. Sure enough, the iconic voice named—and played—the same song.

Les Cooper's metal magic started at intermission, when he showed everyone how to balance eleven nails on a single nail. Then came his real material—first, predicting which of five brass coins a volunteer would choose. (The dramatic reveal: four flipped-over coins were blank, but the chosen coin said "This Coin.") He then seemingly failed to identify a card chosen by volunteer **Valerie Repnau**... only to reveal the card's name written on his "lucky coin."

There's no better birthday present than a set of "wishing coins," as **Dan Cray** demonstrated by showing how the coins not only passed through solid glass but granted his wishes... or at least, their own, warped versions of his wishes.

Howard Paris also made coins do the impossible as a means of proving that "Time is money, and time flies... so money flies!" He also closed out the evening with a treat for everyone to marvel over: an elaborate, metallic gyroscope that demonstrated conservation of momentum in compelling fashion.

The April meeting also featured the return of performance feedback (for those who want it), and a spirited auction of *The Complete Works of Derek Dingle* (first edition) by Richard Kaufman, which was donated by Les. (Congratulations to Brian, the winning bidder!)
