# From the Eyes of A Wizards Wars Judge

Instead of an expensive Tannen's Mystery Box, Phil came to the rescue with an inexpensive Magic "Crapple" Box. Nice job Team Spades.

Being the softhearted person (Judge) I am, how could I not give both Teams a perfect score.

My counterpart was a bit more critical and gave the Teams a slightly less than perfect score.




