
READING MINDS & DROPPING JAWS Mark Gibson Taps Wizards' Deepest Secrets At February Lecture

Members attending the Westside Wizards' February meeting were given a steep promise in last month's newsletter, which proclaimed: "Mark Gibson will make you mental!"

Gibson, an accomplished mentalist, more than lived up to that hype by presenting a lecture loaded with high-impact, audience-tested routines that use streamlined techniques and captivating methods.

His Bob Cassidy-inspired version of the Nova Envelope is a perfect example: a volunteer writes any "secret thought" on a billet, which immediately goes inside an envelope. Moments later, Gibson reveals their exact thought without ever having opened the envelope. "I carry it in my pocket for when I absolutely need to hit," he said, noting he once performed the effect on a cruise ship stage, and then again on the same ship when asked to do closeup for a VIP.

And yet, Gibson doesn't follow the "peek-the-word, get-the-word" formula that many magicians apply to mentalism. Instead, he designs routines that mystify on an emotional level. In his version of a Murder Mystery game, for example, he distributed five envelopes, each containing cards labeled "truth," "liar," or "murderer." Gibson, using a methodology developed by magician Greg Van Holsbeck, then ferreted out which participant was the murderer, in entertaining fashion.



"This just lives in my bag, that's the beautiful thing," said Gibson, a performing member of the Magic Castle for more than 17 years. "It takes up no space. We've all been at gigs where the ukulele player is throwing up in the bathroom, 'we need an extra five minutes, you got anything?' And I can just say, 'yep.' Even during the show, if I need more time I can just pull this out, it's ready to go, and it self-resets."

The only time a prediction attempt went south during Gibson's two-hour lecture—when he asked volunteer Bill Dow to "think of anything" and eventually named the wrong candy bar—he still impressed club members because he knew the answer was, of all things, a candy bar. "The beautiful thing about mentalism," he said, "is you can be wrong and still be right."

Gibson also shared a closeup routine that requires only four business cards and a technique perfected by Max Maven. "So many of us have 'mentalism guilt,' where the second any information is written you feel like you have to get it," Gibson explained. "Max Maven would delay that moment. It was really elegant, and this [business card trick] does the same thing."

"Elegant" is a good way to describe much of Gibson's work... including an opener that he can return to throughout the show. In a nutshell, it involves collecting slips of written information that the audience has freely placed into a box before the show, then having audience members draw slips from the box throughout the show, with Gibson divining whatever is written on the freely drawn slip. Best of all, it plays for both stage and closeup, and constructing the necessary gimmicks costs less than \$20.

"This is my solution to giant auditoriums," Gibson said. "I wanted a genuinely free choice and multiple reveals, without any restrictions—so they could take whatever slip they want. I've had people take multiple slips, choose one that they like, and then put the others back."

That ties to a performing objective that all magicians, mentalists or not, can certainly embrace. "I take as much thinking out of the process as possible," Gibson said. "That way I'm always focused on presentation, plot, and premise." – Dan Cray
