PACKS PETITE, PLAYS POWERFUL David Gabbay's April Lecture Shows Coin Magic At Its Best

Coins and cards might be magic fundamentals, but there was nothing routine about them when **David Gabbay** presented a guest lecture for the Westside Wizards in April.

Gabbay, an acclaimed magician and Magic Castle performer, specializes in offering a modern twist on traditional magic, and he underscored that by astounding club members with expert manipulations that combined classic moves with his own custom accents.

Better yet, all of it was tailored to his audience, and his performing space. "That's an interesting thing about magic: the more you do it, the more you realize what you can use in some situations and not others," Gabbay said, while discussing a coin opener—an empty coin purse that soon produces four Morgan silver dollars.

Though Gabbay designed the effect for his Magic Castle shows, he has since adapted it for larger, less controlled viewing spaces. "That's what I like about performing in random scenarios," he said. "(Effects) are specific, but the more of them you know, the more you'll be able to use in your act."

And, he added, to use them with confidence—even if things go badly. While explaining his method for a favorite coin reappearance, he recalled seeing a performer with an egg bag "who just straight-up dropped the egg. Any other performer—and if it was me—it'd be like, 'oh sh-t,' but he was just [acting] like,



okay, nothing happened... and so, 85 percent of the people didn't know anything had happened."

Gabbay also recalled an Asrah levitation where the performer ripped away the cloth but accidentally sent the form falling to the stage, where it bounced, then landed in the lap of a front row audience member. To Gabbay's astonishment, the stage manager grabbed the form, and the audience was still baffled. "The front row didn't even know what happened, because the woman still vanished, so it didn't really explain anything," he said, noting the takeaway lesson is therefore, "If you're in trouble, don't look at the thing, it'll attract attention."

Gabbay enjoys tailoring his presentations for different venues, especially when it calls for effects that aren't intended for lay audiences. "There's something that really tickles me about tricks that are designed for magicians, like, 'oh this old chestnut,' and then to be able to get laymen with it... I love that," Gabbay says. "I love being able to make people in 2024 get wild with it."

With that in mind, Gabbay feels magicians never lose sight of what drew them to magic. "Sometimes I take out linking rings, and people will lose their business on it," he said. "You've gotta' remember the first time you saw it. You've gotta' keep thinking about what fooled you, and what resonated with you, because that still resonates with other people."

Often times, Gabbay noted, the reason spectators gasp at sudden, magical appearances is because they recognize the elemental nature of the appearance, and it therefore holds emotional significance to them. "I like that: it's not about you, it's what's occurring," he said. "They're really grasping onto that."

By evening's end, Gabbay had shown the Wizards everything from retention vanishes and coin stacks to magnet work and black art—along with effects ranging from "Sweet," the coin-in-sugar-packet routine that generated widespread recognition when it was originally featured in Genii, to his "Coin in Purse to Box" routine that helped him win first place at the 2011 Texas Association of Magicians Close-up competition.

"As far as performing, I just try to keep it fresh," Gabbay said. "I love magic, and I think that's the key to anything: if you love it, the audience can read that. It's back to that whole thing of be yourself. It's simple, but true." – Dan Cray
