The following week, ten of the club's members gathered on a very busy Friday night at Shawn's Pumpkin Patch in West Los Angeles. The Wizards performed two shows at the center of the rectangular, building-side patch, the first a 7:15 show that was extended to a full thirty-minute performance upon request from the patch's management, and then a shorter, fifteen-minute show later in the evening.



**Dan Cray** greeted guests with a haunted bell, then magically refilled an empty, crushed soda can into a new, unopened soda. **Brian Schwartz**, undaunted when his request for a volunteer grew into an entire family of volunteers, easily made their randomly chosen book page vanish, then reappear elsewhere. **Alexander Scianna's** "spirit guide" sent and then retrieved silver dollars before completely transforming a young volunteer's silks into unexpected colors.

Les Cooper mis-made, and then remade, a skeleton to the delight of the crowd, and later drew amused gasps with his shrinking-and-growing head illusion. Phil Goodman enjoyed some good repartee with a volunteer who went silent with astonishment the moment she discovered Phil knew every word she had read from a Sherlock Holmes novel. Phil later rendered a volunteer unable to read, then visually reactivated that person's reading ability, to the crowd's delight.




