### **GOING IN BLINDFOLDED**

### **Wizards Perform Magic While Wearing Blindfolds At November Meeting**

Continuing a run of new meeting themes, the Westside Wizards experimented with "Magic While Blindfolded" in November, as a means of honing non-visual ways to connect with an audience.

**Dan Cray**, using a red bandana for his blindfold, started the night with an act that is banned at the Magic Castle: the Smash and Stab, where one of five paper bags contains a hidden spike and the performer slams a hand upon any four bags that the audience requests. Since Dan was performing Scott Alexander's version ("Nailed It," with the addition of the blindfold), his hands came away from the performance just fine.

A medical face mask served as **Alexander Scianna's** blindfold. After having volunteer Brian Schwartz pick a card, Alex reshuffled the deck then dealt more than thirty cards, until he placed one of them aside, face down. Sure enough, the face-down card was Brian's.

**Les Cooper**, wearing a scarf folded into a ninja-style bandana (which turned out to be a cherished scarf from his service time with the Navy), introduced three ropes hanging from a handheld, wooden bar. The left-side rope had a large brass ring that "jumped" to the right-side rope. Just a gag... or so it seemed, until Les magically made the ring jump to the center rope.

Success was in the cards for **Mel Agcaoili**, who displayed a random jack of hearts, then had a volunteer (Alex) shuffle the deck and name a number between 10 and 20. The blindfolded Mel dealt to that number and found... the jack of hearts.


For **Alan Litteneker**, blindfolds represented a chance to explore secrets close to our hearts, which he emphasized by magically separating the heart cards from the rest of a deck. Using the remaining cards, Alan had one shown to everyone but himself, another shown only to his volunteer, and two more that only Alan would know. Soon, Alan revealed that the four secret cards... were all fives!

Do red playing cards and black playing cards enjoy sticking together? **Phil Goodman** proved they do by performing "Oil and Water" blindfolded. With his eyes covered by a blue bandana, Phil dealt out six cards—three red and three black—mixed them, then turned them over to reveal the matching colors had magically found one another... a feat he then replicated twice.

The blindfolded Wizards not only applied some new approaches to their magic, but realized that blindfolds, like magic, come in many patterns and styles! – *Dan Cray* 


