### A FUN STOP FOR THE NIGHT "BUSS"

#### **Eric Buss Delivers A Memorable Lecture For The Wizards**

The Westside Wizards kicked off the new year similar to the way they wrapped up the previous one: by welcoming a talented guest, in this case **Eric Buss**, who brought his A-game of innovation, humor, and of course magic, to the January meeting.

Buss, a Magic Castle regular who has appeared on the *Late Show with David Letterman* and *America's Got Talent*, was ready with a wall covered in lecture topics for club members to select. "I feel like the magicians who lecture all the time have it down pat, where it's almost a show," he said. "For me, tonight, we're going to keep it casual."

So casual, in fact, that Buss opened with "Stuck Up," a fun, captivating trick centered on a bottle of glue with a nozzle that always winds up pointing upward. "This was a pandemic project for me," Buss said. He shelved it until the pandemic eased up, then polished both the working and the gimmick.

Buss also demonstrated iCut, a torn & restored iPhone charger routine, and iMeasure, in which he is able to "prove" there is a secret, physical tape measure embedded into any wireless phone. He also performed two prototype effects, generating back and forth with several Westside Wizards on how he might be able to fine-tune his solid concepts.

Then there was his "trusty magic wand," which "failed" to locate a selected card three times before Buss "suddenly realized" his wand was actually a rolled-up piece of paper. Naturally, the unrolled paper revealed the name of the chosen card.

The wand trick came about when Buss and his wife thought about rolling paper into scrolls while planning their wedding. "Once we started talking about rolled up tubes, I went 'hey, wait a minute...'" Buss said. "So, at the wedding everyone took a wand from a top hat and that was the program for the wedding... and I just want to pause for a moment to say that I have a wife who allowed me to make magic wands as wedding favors!"

Buss also told fascinating, albeit sobering stories about his TV appearances, where he performed a synchronized, fireworks-style routine with canned, spring snakes. Though grateful for the visibility, the experiences weren't what he had anticipated. He did, however, make the number one slot on David Letterman's "Top Ten Signs You're Not Going To Win A Nobel Peace Prize: You're on Letterman playing with a bunch of spring snakes."

Buss laughed about the needling from Letterman. "Yes, I'm number one!" he joked. "Mission accomplished." All joking aside, the Westside Wizards would certainly agree. - Dan Cray

We would like to THANK all present and past members for their support over the last 15 years. Without you there would not be a Westside Wizards.




